## Investment Policy

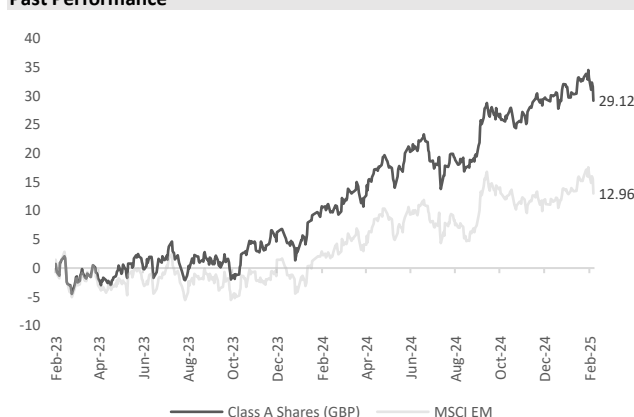

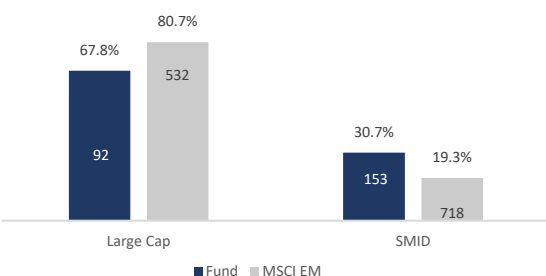

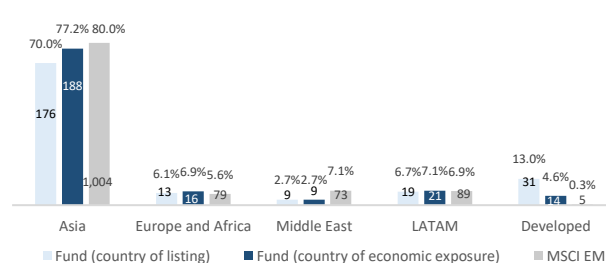

### Exhibit 2: Market Cap Composition



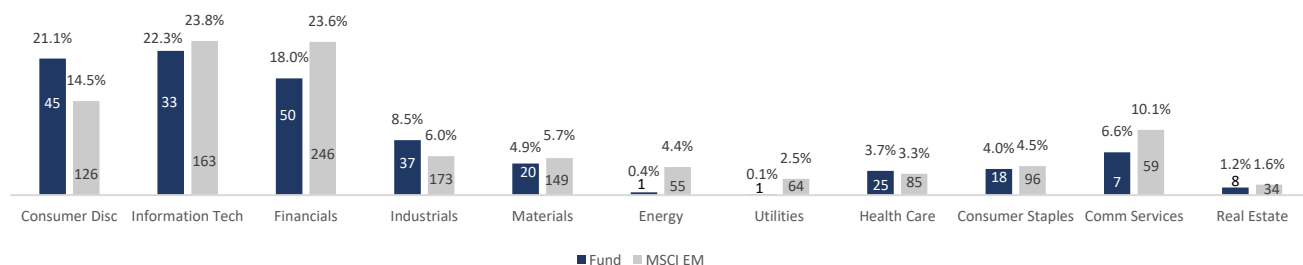

### Performance Review

The Fund was down 1.1% in February 2025, underperforming the benchmark by 26bps. The key contributors, in USD terms, include Naspers (+12.9%), Hong Kong Exchanges (+16.1%), and Prosus (+13.6%), whereas International Gemmological Institute (-19.9%), Raia Drogasil (-18.0%), and Trip.com (-20.2%) were the key detractors.

For the month, Consumer Discretionary and Communication Services outperformed, while Energy and Utilities underperformed. Large caps outperformed mid and small caps this month. Among major EM markets, China and Poland outperformed, while India and Indonesia underperformed.

### Market Review

In February 2025, the MSCI EM index was down 0.8%. It outperformed other global indices like the US equities (S&P 500) and MSCI World which returned -2.4% and -1.8%, respectively.<sup>11</sup>
